#### A step towards self-sustainability for rural elders

HelpAge has been supporting various livelihood initiatives through Elder-Self-Help-Groups (ESHGs) with the aim of making rural elders independent and self-sufficient. One such support was provided to the women of Jharkhand in association with the Jharkhand Livelihood Promotion Society (JSLPS) for elderly inclusion under the National Rural Livelihoods Mission (NRLM) framework.

20 active women members from Women-Self-Help-Groups formed by the Government of Jharkhand, in JSLPS project areas - Ranchi, West Singhbhoom and Pakur districts, were identified as Internal Community Resource Persons and sent to districts in Bihar - Supaul, Darbhanga and Madhubani, for a 10-day training and exposure program to learn the workings of a successful Elder-Self-Help-Group by interacting with their members. They then returned to their villages along with their elder friends, representatives from these ESHGs in Bihar, who worked as external resource persons helping them set-up ESHGs in their own villages in Jharkhand.

This exchange of information and methods will go long way in expanding the NRLM reach, helping more and more needy elders in becoming self-reliant.

#### Strengthening grass-root advocacy initiatives in Maharashtra

#### Nationwide focus on 'Digital Empowerment of Elderly'

In today's day and age of moving towards a cashless society, elders often get left behind. Unable to cope with the fast pace of growing digital technology, often their daily existence gets hampered, it also alienates them from the younger generation who are largely digitally dependent. With new models of smart phones flooding the markets every day, new mobile applications, usage of debit/credit cards and mobile wallets becoming a norm, it is virtually impossible to ignore their use. Applications like Skype, Facebook, WhatsApp, can help connect them with their friends and loved ones, but are still unknown to many. HelpAge has therefore been conducting training workshops across the country to digitally empower our elders. Here are some snapshots.

#### **DELHI**

Ms. Sampat Bai, 70 years, was found in a bedraggled condition, living on the road outside a petty shop in Dehradun (Uttarakhand). She had lost her way and traveled to Dehradun in search of visiting a temple. A good Samaritan referred her case to the HelpAge Dehradun Elder Helpline. The language she spoke was local Malvi, which helped in identifying her as a native of Madhya Pradesh. Her documents were subsequently recovered with her co-operation and a huge rescue operation was launched by different HelpAge State Offices and the State Police machinery. Finally she was reunited with

family, but soon went missing again after a few months, HelpAge intervened yet again. Today, she is reunited with her son and family, and is extremely thankful to the team for not giving up on her.
