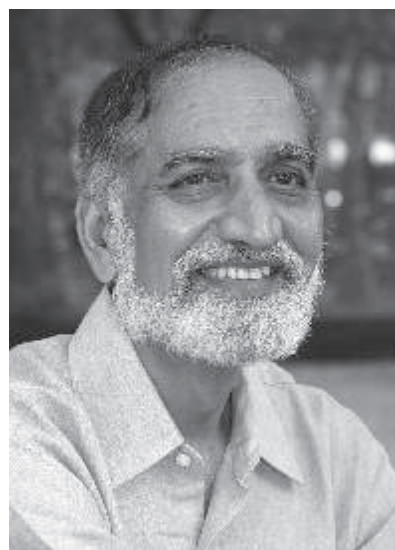

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRPERSON



India is home to one out of every 10 senior citizens of the world. The old age dependency ratio is slowly increasing in both rural and urban areas, which is a matter of concern for the State, communities and families. Also, with growing migration of young adults, the problem is even more serious in rural areas.

In India there are many older people who are bedridden and isolated. There is a crying need for a policy on homecare for the elderly in India. The most acute need is care for those who are bed-bound and immobile. While health systems wake up to the unique needs of elders, the private sector understands the demand for trained manpower. It is therefore, imperative to explore the community and family care-giver model, and their capacity built. Given the inevitable quantum jump in the elderly population in the coming years, in what is being termed as the 'Grey Tsunami', our preparedness as a country is inadequate, to say the least.

It is in this context that in the year 2018-19, HelpAge India renewed its focus on homecare for elderly. The year also marked a major milestone for HelpAge India as it completed 40 years in service of the disadvantaged elderly, a long and challenging journey. In these four decades, we have spread our wings across the length and breadth of the country, reaching out and servicing elders in need, from Leh in the north to Kanyakumari in the south, and from Dwarakadheesh in the west to Agartala in the east.

Our mobile healthcare network today has expanded considerably, criss-crossing the country, to provide basic medical care to destitute elders and their community. We also scaled up our initiatives in livelihood programs for the elderly, with 'aspirational districts' also now being included. On the urban front, we continue to empower our elders through Digital Literacy workshops, as elders no longer want to be left behind with increasing focus on digitization of India. These workshops go a long way in keeping elders from being socially isolated.

HelpAge India has been voicing the demand for elder rights and accessibility to those rights for a long time with Central and State Governments. This year, our focus was on bringing the agenda for Universalization and Increase in Pension for Elders, to the forefront. Our efforts saw successes with some State Governments increasing the pension amount for elders in their respective states. We will continue our efforts till all States walk the same line.

We are a country of more than 1.3 billion people, we come together and donate generously during disasters, to always help those in need, reflecting our humanity as a society. We need to continue doing that on a regular and even greater basis.

It is truly an overwhelming experience to see the dedication of my staff and colleagues. It is because of their sheer hard work, dedication and the consistent and unstinted support of our donors, that we at HelpAge India have been able to make a difference, however small, in the lives of our elderly.

As I look ahead, I see the challenge is immense and our work endless, but we will continue in our efforts to provide our elders with a good quality of life and help restore their dignity.

MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

This year was indeed a very special year for us, as we marked our 40th anniversary. We have grown over the years from a relief and welfare based organization, to a rights based organization working towards providing long term sustainable solutions to elders. Over the years our span of work has covered not just the rural destitute elder, but also the urban disadvantaged elder who faces challenges in home care, abuse, and keeping up with digital India amongst others.

There are an estimated 106 million elders in India today. 96 million are still working simply to survive. A reality which is mind boggling. Most of the elderly live a life of destitution, ill health, neglect and abuse, and devoid of their fundamental right to live with dignity. We have observed in our work there are thousands, if not millions of elderly spending their lives alone with nobody to care for them.

To provide some form of agecare to these bedridden elders, we conducted a pilot study in 3 locations Leh (J&K), Cuddalore (TN), Shimla (HP), to understand the caregiving space better. The findings were insightful with 53.8% of elderly reporting that they needed help from others to carry out basic daily living activities like feeding, bathing, dressing, grooming etc. A majority of the caregivers were from within the family and mostly female members. We have begun a pilot project in these 3 states to find a solution for these bedridden elders at home.

The pension for poor older people continues at Rs.200 a month, which is against human dignity. In order to change the policy of pension for older people, we organized a Pension Rally, marking International Day of Older Persons, bringing to the forefront the dire need for Universalization and Increase in the Pension amounts for elders. Over 11,000 poor elders from 24 states assembled in front of the Parliament, putting forth their demands. Some states have begun to change the pension amount to Rs. 2000 per month, which is a big success for older people.

It was also one of our toughest years with the onset of two major disasters, the entire state of Kerala being devastated by floods due to torrential rains over a period of two months, followed by Cyclone Gaja, a 'very severe cyclonic storm' affecting districts in coastal Tamil Nadu. The challenge that lay ahead of our relief teams was immense as they had to venture into remote areas while communication was totally cut off, and accessibility limited. I am extremely proud of our foot soldiers who worked day and night, reaching out and providing relief and medicines to those who needed it most.

This journey of 40 years would have been impossible had it not been for the support from our donors from all spheres - corporates, individuals, schools, institutions and partners. I thank them deeply for their continued belief and support towards the elder cause. I hope they continue to walk the mile with us in creating a society where our work in the practice of equality, justice and dignity for senior citizens can be fulfilled.

STORIES FROM THE FIELD

As we continue to reach and serve disadvantaged elders across the country, we see a common thread of need amongst all our elders. A need to live a healthy life with dignity and independence. This year we travelled deep into the mountainous terrain of Uttarakhand, travelling into remote villages visiting our elders and hearing their story of change, to further understand their needs and assess the impact of our services on ground.

RESTORATION OF SIGHT

“I had forgotten how the world looks, but now I can see clearly.”

Padma Rawat, 64 years, eyes light up each time you meet her. A widower from Pauri, Garhwal district, Uttarakhand, for years she suffered from blurred vision and eye pain. She was unable to see faces and objects clearly. She has two children, but both abandoned her and left her alone to fend for herself. With no money for a simple eye test or even basic medicine, her condition worsened. She had virtually given up on life when a good Samaritan found her and placed her at Sai Vridh Ashram, an old age home in Dehradun.

HelpAge organizes free eye camps at the home every month, for the old and destitute elder residents, offering free eye check-ups, medicines, spectacles and conducts free cataract surgeries.

Padma finally got her eye tested, started receiving medicines and got corrective spectacles from the medical team.

Today, Padma doesn't have pain in her eyes anymore and can see clearly now. The spectacles have given her a new lease of life. It has made her independent enough to carry on with daily activities without support from anyone.

MOBILE HEALTHCARE UNIT

Life for 71 year old, Kalawati Devi from Arkhun village, Agatyamuni Block, Rudraprayag district, Uttarakhand, had never been easy. She had no relatives or family to care for her. She used to earn her daily wage as a farm laborer, but things spiraled downwards when Kalawati developed high blood pressure and diabetes. This made it difficult for her to carry on work, severely affecting her livelihood.

Her village was not easily accessible by transport and the nearest local market was situated further away in town, making it difficult for elders like her to travel. Therefore with no support system, failing health and lack of accessibility to a medical facility, Kalawati continued to live with the pain and discomfort.

Most women in Uttarakhand, are the main bread earners in the family and work in the fields alongside their husbands. They are hard-working and work well into their later years, despite the physical challenges they face with increasing age.



After the flash-floods of 2013 that struck Uttarakhand, caused extensive damage to life and property,



HelpAge India spread the reach of its Mobile Healthcare Unit (MHU) into remote villages. The MHU team travelled deep into these villages, often on foot as they were no proper roads for transportation, and climbed tough mountain terrain to reach those affected by the disaster, most were elders like Kalawati, who simply could not walk or climb down to access relief material.

Kalawati also got herself checked and now receives medication for her blood pressure & diabetes regularly from the MHU. The Unit visits her village every week, and people from neighbouring villages also visit the MHU site, to avail its services.

The MHU is equipped with medicines, a doctor, pharmacist & social worker and covers nearly 20 villages providing disadvantaged elders & their community, free health check-ups, blood tests, and medicines.

Today, Kalawati is healthy, happy and back to work. She has also joined the local *Mahila Dal*, a group of women who are involved in community service.

PHYSIOCARE

Life for 62 year old, Bahatar Lal, a native of Agustyamuni block, Rudraprayag district, Uttarakhand, has significantly changed since 2013 after he visited HelpAge India's Physiotherapy Centre in the district.

He suffered a paralytic attack in the same year, resulting in complete loss of voice and his right side becoming paralyzed. Bedridden, with no hope of ever walking again, he consulted a local hospital and started receiving treatment, but his condition did not improve. The doctors had virtually given up.

He kept getting referred to different hospitals and doctors until he finally came to HelpAge India's Physiotherapy Centre. He started his treatment and slowly started showing signs of improvement, this encouraged him further and since then he has not missed a day and comes regularly to the Centre.

Today, Bahatar can walk on his own without a stick or a helping hand, his speech has improved considerably and he can utter full words now. He is healthier and happier, but most of all hopeful and believes that he will soon heal completely.



LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

How old would you be, if you didn't know how old you were - Satchel Paige



“I feel good when I am working. It keeps my body and my mind healthy.”

75 year old, Bacchan Singh Batola, is a member of the HelpAge India's livelihood program, in Ukhimath village, Rudraprayag district, Uttarakhand. He has a wife, a son, and a daughter who is a widower and mentally challenged, along with a young grand-daughter.

Bacchan takes care of his daughter and grand-daughter, since his son and daughter-in-law don't care much for him, his wife, or the sister. Their main source of income use to come from milking the cows and the grains he planted around his little hut. The income was not enough to sustain Bacchan and his family, but farming was all he knew. His wife a regular MHU beneficiary, told the HelpAge team about how they were struggling to make ends meet.

HelpAge provided Bacchan with seeds for plantation and taught him how to do Vermicomposting. He soon made a small pit outside his little hut, where he started making manure for the field. The compost formed was light in weight and easy to carry around the mountains. The crops were much better in quality. Another advantage of Vermicomposting is that it helps in retaining the moisture in the ground for a longer period of time, thereby extending the period for the plantation of crops and increasing the gross produce.

Today Bacchan has more than enough to feed his family. He has also become the local environmentalist and puts his knowledge to good use. He has planted nearly 1000 trees in his village and continues to do so even today. He has become an inspiration for all in the village. Like Bacchan, HelpAge supports many other farmers like him in Vermicomposting.

DIGITAL LITERACY

Digital Literacy, the ability to use technology to navigate, evaluate and create information

64 year old, Narendra Kumar Sahni is a member of the Senior Citizens Association (SCA) in Mussoorie, Uttarakhand, which was established 10 years ago. The members of the Association are educated and well informed, but face the challenge of keeping up with changing digital technology, especially in retired life.

Sahni, worked for an insurance company and retired four years ago, though he still functions as a consultant from time to time. He lives with his wife, children and grandchildren and is quite happy with his life. Although he is well versed in using his smart phone, he still faces the challenge of doing online banking transactions, and prefers the traditional way of going to the bank and doing it in person.

HelpAge realized the dire need for Digital literacy classes for Sahni and elders like him, who are unable to keep up with the changing pace of technology. Under its Digital Literacy program, HelpAge conducted a Digital workshop for the SCA Mussoorie members of which Sahni is a member of, teaching them the basics of how to use a Smart Phone, do online transactions, connect with their loved ones, children & grandchildren settled out of state or country, learn how to use popular Apps such as Skype, WhatsApp and Facebook, how to Google Search, browse through YouTube etc.

Today, Sahni has become independent & net savvy, and navigates his way across the web, reading up on the latest news & happenings online and is far more connected with the friends, family and the world outside.

Shenbagavalli, 76 years, from Kolathur, Chennai, Tamil Nadu, was left abandoned by her own daughter who was too poor to take care of her. Her son is a diabetic and medically unfit to look after her, while her husband is admitted in a mental institution. Left in a dire condition with no support system, life for Shenbagavalli was a struggle.

Things turned around for her when a good Samaritan saw her on the road and called the HelpAge Elder Helpline. The Helpline team rushed to the spot. Seeing her fragile condition and no available care for her, the team brought her under the safe haven of Maria Mercy Home, an old age home in Kodungaiyur, Chennai, Tamil Nadu. Shenbagavalli today has found a new home away from home, and is happy to have found new friends of her own.

The HelpAge Elder Helpline runs across 21 state capitals across the country, offering assistance to older persons in need of emergency care and protection. The Helpline teams rescue abandoned elders, counsel those in distress, provide legal support and information related to various services available for elders. The Helpline works as a co-ordination unit, linking elders in need to old age homes, hospitals, geriatric specialists, police, government etc, so they can lead a life of dignity. HelpAge has also launched the 'HelpAge SOS' App to ensure help is just a click away.



HEMOCARE

Krishnan, 65 years, from Pudhupalayam, Cuddalore (TN), was a blessed man with a loving family consisting of his wife, two daughters and a son. The couple worked together selling garments door-to-door until life took a turn for the worst, when Krishnan suffered a stroke and was affected by paralysis.

Without the support of the chief bread earner of the family, survival was an uphill task. From earning enough to provide for two square meals per day, the family now had the huge burden of managing the medical expenses of Krishnan too. Out of desperation, his son and younger daughter migrated to Chennai looking for odd jobs. The cost of living, medicines and treatment was too much and the family struggled hard to make ends meet. The entire weight of responsibility to look after Krishnan, fell on the shoulders of his wife, who started to work as a Mason. Her earnings as a Mason were barely enough to meet their food needs. Most of the time, she was unable to leave him alone, in absence of anyone to look after him and had to forego work.

Krishnan originally a very active person in society and a member of the local association, now restricted himself to his home. Being dependent on others for his basic needs such as bathing, feeding walking etc, made him feel ashamed and helpless. He slowly started feeling like a burden on the family, started losing his confidence and felt isolated, which eventually pushed him towards depression.

When all seemed lost, a ray of hope came in the form of HelpAge Homecare volunteer G. Manikkavali. She identified Krishnan as a beneficiary in need of Homecare, and became his primary carer. Trained by the HelpAge Homecare team and AIIMS Nursing Team, her presence not only helped Krishnan become better, but also gave time for his wife to earn her livelihood.

Regular physiotherapy exercises have helped improve his condition and increased his mobility, Krishnan's blood pressure is also monitored regularly to ensure stability of health, increasing his self-confidence.

Homecare for elderly in India

The dire need for Homecare for elderly in the country was highlighted by a first-of-its-kind report titled '*Homecare for Elderly in India*' released by HelpAge to bring the issue to the forefront. HelpAge has piloted homecare training projects in 3 locations – Leh (J&K), Shimla (HP) and Cuddalore (TN), which formed the basis of the report.

With a sample size of 2500 elder respondents, the report brought out the hard reality of the state of elder homecare in the country. India is the second largest in global population of elderly citizens. Most of the elderly in the country live a life of destitution and suffer from ill health, neglect and abuse.

HelpAge through its Homecare program trains community & family caregivers of *bed bound & immobile elderly*, to help elders with their day-to-day living activities. Therefore, a community entry strategy has been adopted, which involves the village *Sarpanch* (Head) and community.

SALIENT FINDINGS Homecare report

- 53.8% of elderly in the survey reported that they need help from others to carry out their Activities of Daily Living (ADL), things we normally do ourselves like - feeding, bathing, dressing, grooming, work, homemaking and leisure activities.
- 97.8% elderly reported the need for support in Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADL), specialized daily activities that require skill - ranging from traveling to outside places, managing money, shopping etc.
- 59% of the elderly suffering from long-term disease require regular medication.
- As compared to Shimla and Cuddalore, Leh reported a very high need of Homecare services (55.8%).
- It is interesting to note that female elderly (57%), outnumbered male elderly in the need for help. Across all three locations it was observed that the preference was for female care givers.
- More than three-fourths of the elderly (76%) preferred to have caregivers from the local population, the percentage was higher in Leh (96%) as against Shimla (81%) and Cuddalore (33%).
- 47% of the respondents who were 'bed bound & immobile' preferred family members and someone known to them to deliver care.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS 2018-19

- 174 Mobile Healthcare Units (MHU) provided 29.39 lakh free treatments in basic healthcare, across 2586 community locations, in 25 states.
- 4837 awareness and health camps across the country, provided treatment to another 1.88 lakh beneficiaries.
- 5268 home visits conducted for bedridden patients by the MHU team.
- 1,67,251 Physiotherapy treatments to elders across 34 locations
- 49,090 calls received through the toll-free Elders Helpline across 21 states.
- 1138 abandoned elderly rescued.
- 37,785 home care visits to the elderly at their doorstep in Leh, Shimla and Cuddalore and 820 caregivers trained.
- 73,360 elderly supported through 5701 Elder-Self-Help Groups in 8 states.
- 56,168 elderly successfully linked to government schemes and entitlements.
- 11,216 senior citizens empowered through Digital Literacy workshops.
- 35,000 surgeries conducted and nearly 1.8 lakh patients screened through 1587 camps, across 15 States, covering 120 districts.
- 5 barrier free homes run for the aged in 3 states.
- 26 homes for the aged supported pan India.
- More than 5000 Senior Citizens Associations partnered with across India with more than 10 lakh members.

DISASTER RELIEF & REHABILITATION

During disasters the worst affected are the elderly, for they can't run towards safer ground or reach relief vehicles in time and are often pushed aside by younger more able bodied persons. Two major disasters occurred during the year in the South of India, in Kerala & Tamil Nadu, leaving behind a wake of death and destruction. Lakhs of people lost their homes, livelihood and were without shelter and food. Clean drinking water was difficult to find as floods & landslides not only destroyed property & livestock, but also disrupted electricity & water supply.



The state of Kerala was devastated by floods due to continuous torrential rains during the months of July & August 2018. Overflowing dams, landslides and floods washed away acres of land and left the state reeling in shock and unable to cope with the magnitude of the disaster. By August 15th, all 14 districts of the State were placed on red alert. According to the Kerala Government, one-sixth of the total population of Kerala had been directly affected by floods and related incidents. The Indian government declared it a *Level 3* calamity, or '*calamity of a severe nature*'.

On the other hand, Cyclone Gaja affected the districts of Nagapattinam & Ramanathapuram in coastal Tamil Nadu. Identified as a '*very severe cyclonic storm*', with strong winds of about 170–180 km/h the cyclone affected even the neighbouring districts of Thanjavur, Thiruvavur and Pudukottai.

HelpAge India's disaster management team immediately responded, reaching out to the affected with medical, food and non-food relief items. In Kerala, relief kits were given to 2790 families in the districts of Wayanad & Idukki. The disaster response team went deep into the tribal areas of Wayanad, Idukki, Palakkad and Pathanamthitta to reach the unreached, where transportation was a major challenge. In Nagapattinam district of Tamil Nadu, 2120 families of elderly, were reached out to.

As part of the rehabilitation measures in Kerala, two new Emergency Medical Relief Centres at Chundale (Wayanad) and Kanjikuzhy (Idukki) were established and the services of the e-Health Centre in Nadavayal, Wayanad were extended. Two Mobile Healthcare Units in Idukki & Kochi were immediately put into operation. In Tamil Nadu, rehabilitation through livelihood restoration activities was done, by providing more than 35,000 grafted three-year-old fruit saplings, for the local community, who were predominantly horticulturists.

ADVOCACY

During the year, progress was made on Rights, Entitlements and Policy changes for senior citizens of India. This was due to the laborious and painstaking 'legal advocacy' by HelpAge CEO, Mr. Mathew Cherian as '*Amicus Curae*' in the case for Elder Rights as promised by the Constitution of India, since filing the PIL in 2016, in the Writ Petition for enforcement of Rights of Older Persons under Article 21 of the Constitution.

On December 13th 2018, the senior citizens of India got a landmark judgement in their favour. It was for the first time perhaps in India's legal history, such a judgement was given, on the fast emerging social issues of elderly in the country. The Supreme Court in its judgement read the Right to life with Dignity of the elderly, under the mandate of Article 21. The Court issued a set of directions on the need to review pensions, provision of medical care, prepare a plan of action for giving publicity to the 'Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act' and appropriate directions to the State Governments for effective implementation. The Court also stated the need to continuously monitor the progress in the implementation of the Constitutional Mandate.

Historic rally for Universalization of Pension for Elders

HelpAge continued its ongoing advocacy efforts for elder rights during the year. It marked 'International Day of Older Persons' this year by pushing forth the 'Demand for Universal Pension' for elders. A historic rally



was organized in the national capital on September 30th followed by a *Jan Manch* (Peoples Assembly) in front of the Parliament, to highlight to the MPs and Government, the need for Universalization & Increase in Pensions for elders.

Over 11,000 poor elders from 24 states assembled in front of the Parliament. This was done in association with Pension Parishad, a national network of over 100 grassroots organizations that works with poor & marginalized elders,

amongst others. A report was also released on '*State of Pensions in India - 2018*' for advocacy with various stakeholders.

A 'Right to Pension' campaign was carried out through various events such as awareness rallies, signature campaigns, walkathons, street plays etc. in different parts of the country. As a result, 2018 saw increase in pensions and geriatric facilities for elders in several States.

Former President of India, Mr. Pranab Mukherjee, graced the formal function in Delhi and shared his views on the importance of pension for elderly, besides felicitating centenarians and honouring our donors for their immense contribution to the elder cause.

ADVOCACY



DISCONNECT TO CONNECT Campaign against Elder Abuse

The growing instances of Elder Abuse in India, are a matter of grave concern. The most common forms of abuse are disrespect, verbal abuse and neglect besides economic exploitation. Over the years, HelpAge has been trying to bring the issue to the forefront to empower elders and sensitize the young. Marking 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day' on June 14th, 2018, HelpAge launched a nationwide report titled 'Elder Abuse in India: Changing Cultural Ethos & Impact of Technology'. The report explored the extent of Elder Abuse in India and the impact of technology. The report revealed that nearly one-fourth (25%) elders experienced abuse. The main abusers were their own Son (52%) and Daughter-in-law (34%). 65% elderly stated that extreme attention given to phones/ computers was disrespectful. 73% elders felt that 'their adult children are too busy on the phone, even when at home with them.'

HelpAge ran a nationwide campaign titled 'Disconnect to Connect' with the aim of sensitizing young adults, the primary abusers, urging them to disconnect from their smart phones & gadgets and connect with the elders in their own home. The campaign went viral, striking a chord with the younger generation. All across the country the campaign ran, with various events taking place, such as signature campaigns, candle light marches, street theatre, auto-rickshaw campaigns, walkathons, awareness campaigns at public spaces like metros and bus stations etc.

SALIENT FINDINGS Elder Abuse Report

- Nearly one-fourth (25%) elders experienced abuse.
- The main abusers were Son (52%) and Daughter-in-law (34%).
- The median age of abuser was 42 years.
- The most common form of abuse experienced was Disrespect (56%), Verbal Abuse (49%) and Neglect (33%). Economic Exploitation was 22% and Beating & Slapping was a disturbing 12%.
- They had been facing this since the past 5 years.
- 65% elderly stated that extreme attention given to phones/ computers was disrespectful.
- 73% elders felt that 'their adult children were too busy on the phone even when at home with them.'
- 82% of those abused, did not report the matter.
- The key reasons for Not Reporting - were to 'maintain confidentiality of family matter (52%)' or 'did not know how to deal with problem (34%)'.
- Top 3 most effective ways to deal with Elder Abuse was – 'Sensitize children & strengthen inter-generational bonding' (38%), 'Increase Economic Independence of the abused' (37%) and 'Sensitize Young Adults' (35%).

As part of HelpAge's 40 year milestone, a National Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Conference was held in Delhi, on the theme of sustainable development goals, titled – 'Leave no one behind'. The Conclave brought together key members of the corporate industry, government and civil society, with Chief Guest, Dr. Amarjeet Sinha, Secretary - Ministry of Rural Development, Govt. of India. The aim was to examine the possibilities of leveraging CSR initiatives to enhance inclusion of marginalized communities in the process of economic & social development. The discussions centred on the need for CSR to address larger societal issues, to go beyond merely meeting statutory guidelines. CSR should aim to fulfil the Social Development Goals via inclusion of those often left behind. In particular, older people, especially older women are among the most disadvantaged sections of Indian society. Social protection, basic services and infrastructure should be made accessible to all.
