KERALA: REBUILDING LIVES

6479 Medical treatments, 2790 family relief kits for continued rehabilitation work



Kerala witnessed one of the worst floods of the century as flood waters wreaked havoc in the state. Lakhs of people lost their home and were without shelter and food, even clean water was difficult to find as floods and landslides not only destroyed property and livestock, but disrupted electricity and the water supply. Due to excess water, the danger of water-borne diseases increased, claiming more lives and spreading fear amongst people.

While disaster in any form affects all, elders suffer the most. Due to age, their mobility is restricted and therefore seeking shelter or rushing to safer ground becomes difficult. The Government of Kerala faced a huge task of rebuilding the state requiring major development challenges, faced by the state in a 100 years.

People from all across the country and the world, stood together to support those affected in Kerala. HelpAge India

started rescue and relief operations immediately and worked against all odds at ground zero. A total of 6479 treatments were carried out through 94 camps by 6 Medical Healthcare Units. 2790 families were reached out with relief kits (food + non-food) in Idukki and Wayanad district, covering an area of 1228 sq.kms. HelpAge provided medical treatments and relief kits to the needy in tribal areas of Wayanad, Idukki, Palakkad and Pathanamthitta.

Mr. Mathew Cherian, CEO, HelpAge India, visited the disaster site to assess the situation and plan for implementing the rehabilitation phase. Although, the government has already started the rehabilitation work in the state, it will take time and efforts to restore normalcy in Kerala. HelpAge India is doing rehabilitation work in the most severely affected areas of Idukki and Wayanad districts. The focus is on medical rehabilitation and bringing the health system back to normal.
