# EDITOR Speaks *K*

#### Dear Reader,

Greetings! The last quarter of 2022 was an eventful one with many new initiatives being taken up for our senior citizens. HelpAge India marked 'International Day of Older Persons' with the launch of '*Saarthak'* – a community-based initiative for the Mental Wellbeing of Elderly, in collaboration with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS), with 'National Programme for Health Care of Elderly' (NPHCE) providing technical support. Mental health issues such as loneliness, depression and anxiety, have been on the rise among the elderly, especially since the COVID-19 pandemic, but little attention has been given to this vulnerable segment of the population.

On the other hand, in a move to digitally empower India's elders with focus on ensuring they are protected against internet fraud and scams, we launched 'Project *Surakshit*', an online safety skills program for 50,000 elders across India, with grant support from Google.org. Live workshops are being held across the country where senior citizens get guidance on how to identify online scams and what online safety measures to take, while paying their utility bills, doing online banking transactions, booking cabs etc.

Creating history, one of our landmark projects was launched in one of the remotest regions of the country, with the inauguration of the national helpline, Elderline (14567) for senior citizens in Ladakh, aiming to serve and protect elders living in this region. Operationalised by HelpAge India in collaboration with the National Institute of Social Defence, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India and Department of Social & Tribal Welfare, Ladakh, we hope to reach the unreached vulnerable elders of this region.

A common theme that ran through the most significant landmarks of the past few months was of creating inclusion, access and a sense of community for senior citizens.

Lastly, we were honoured to be recognised for our service to the cause of impoverished elders in India with the Sat Paul Mittal Platinum Award 2022.

Our focus continues to be on keeping our elders safe, healthy and happy. The support that we extend to each and every elder and their family, would not be possible without you, our donors.

## HelpAge India marks 'International Day of Older Persons'

On the eve of UN 'International Day of Older Persons', HelpAge India launched '*Saarthak*' a community-based initiative for the Mental Wellbeing of Elderly, in collaboration with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS), a leader in the area of mental health and neurosciences, with the 'National Programme for Health Care of Elderly' (NPHCE) providing technical support. The project aims to strengthen the community based mental health care support, by building the capacity of 10,000 non-specialist health workforce and community caregivers, on geriatric mental health across the country, over a period of one year and subsequent scale-up.

The project was jointly launched at Delhi's India International Centre, by Dr. Ritu Rana, Mission Head – Healthcare, HelpAge India, and Dr. P.T. Sivakumar, Professor of Psychiatry Unit, Head Geriatric Psychiatry Unit, NIMHANS, in the presence of Dr. Vinod K. Paul, Member, NITI Aayog, Govt. of India, and Mr. Rakesh Bharti

## VISION RESTORATION - Regaining Life's Radiance



65-year-old Ningavva Kunnur belongs to a remote village in the Dharwad district of Karnataka. She got married at a young age and had dreams of a happy family with children, who would bring joy in the couple's life and support them in their old age. However, it was not meant to be. She lost seven children during childbirth. Due to financial constraints the couple could not seek any medical solutions for their situation and eventually gave up on having children. 15 years ago, Ningavva lost her only source of support and companionship, with the death of her husband. Since then, Ningavva has been staying all alone in a tiny house with bare minimum facilities, surviving on the meagre financial support provided by the government.

Soon Ningavva began noticing the vision in both her eyes slowly started failing, making it difficult to carry on even simple daily tasks for survival. Being alone, she had no one to help her or accompany her to the hospital to get her eyes checked. Fortunately, she heard from her neighbours that there was a free eye check-up camp being organised in a neighbouring village by HelpAge India. Ningavva decided go along with her neighbours.

In the camp, she was diagnosed with cataract in both eyes. She was told that since she could not afford the surgery, it would be free of cost for her and that she need not worry about affordability. It was a huge relief for Ningavva, and she readily agreed for surgery. She was then taken to HelpAge India's

partner hospital in Hubli, where she underwent the surgery and intra-ocular lens implants. For Ningavva, regaining her eyesight was like having her life back and the strength to take on whatever challenges life would now throw at her.

HelpAge India launched a unique campaign titled 'Aankhon Ka Tara', aimed at helping restore vision of India's disadvantaged elderly, who for the want of a simple pair of spectacles or cataract surgery, are unable to see or live life with dignity.

## LAUNCH OF 'Project *Surakshit*' WITH SUPPORT OF Google.org

Mr. Karnik spoke about how COVID-19 was a learning experience that revealed the need to fine-tune our health systems and that in order to understand elder needs and challenges better, we need advancements in geriatric research.
