An integral part of our elder population which often is the last and lost in line, when it comes to addressing their needs, are older women. This year marking 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day', for the first time we delved into exploring this area and released a nationwide research report titled 'Women and Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?'. The report which was released across the country, shed light on the status of older women in India and their needs. It explored the aspects of elder abuse and discrimination, ownership of older women to financial resources, employment opportunities, health care needs, digital inclusion, safety and use of redressal mechanisms among others.

There was also a deep focus on conducting awareness & training sessions vis a vis elder caregiving. As per the report, 67% of older women are taking care of family members who are unable to carry out their daily activities. HelpAge India's elderly caregiving training programme is helping reduce their burden, by upskilling unemployed youth from disadvantaged backgrounds to become caregivers and link them to gainful employment. We are proud to share that this programme is now certified with the National Skill Development Corporation under the 'Skill India' programme.

We also continue to track the impact we are making on ground, through the lives we have touched. The journey of Nirod Baran Adak from West Bengal, that you will read in this edition of the Newsletter, is one such inspiring story. He is not only an example of active ageing but also a contributor to climate change, a true ecological warrior who has impacted the community.

Another new initiative, that aims to bring together generations, is our 'Digital GuruCool' programme, which combines our Student Action for Value Education (SAVE) and our Digital Literacy programme for senior citizens. It is heart-warming to see students take on the role of 'digital gurus' by teaching senior citizens how to navigate the digital world through their smartphones.

We will continue in our efforts to empower India's elders and help them live healthy and dignified lives. For this, we look forward to your continued support and goodwill. Let us together fill their lives with love and joy as we enter the New Year!

HelpAge India, marked UN-recognized 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day' (June 15) with the release of its nationwide report - 'Women & Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?' at the India International Centre, New Delhi. It also launched its campaign focusing on women's needs, titled #MainBhiHoon. A first-of-its-kind report, it explores the aspects of elder abuse and discrimination, access and ownership of older women to financial resources, employment and employability, health care, social and digital inclusion, safety and security, awareness and use of redressal mechanisms and much more.

The survey was conducted by research agency - Ipsos Research Private Limited. The report was spread across the length and breadth of the country covered both rural & urban India spanning across 20 States & 2 Union Territories and 5 Metro Cities, with a sample size of 7911, covering SEC B, C & D categories.

The report findings have helped facilitate dialogue around the financial, social, digital, health and well-being related needs of older women at various levels. We are now working with stakeholders across the private and public sectors to initiate collaborative efforts to best address the challenges faced by older women and provide policy and implementation level solutions, to ensure holistic inclusion of the female ageing population of our country.

LADAKH



The Hon'ble Lt. Governor Brig (Dr.) BD Mishra, graced our event at Leh Elders Village, Ladakh and released the nationwide report.

CHHATTISGARH

Shri R.K. Vij, Former Spl. DGP, Chhattisgarh, graced our event in Raipur, released the report and addressed the issues of ageing through a moving speech.



SALIENT FINDINGS OF THE REPORT

Women & Ageing: Invisible or Empowered?

- 81% older women live with their families.
- 44% older women are widowed.
- 50% older women consider elder abuse to be prevalent.
- 16% older women have faced elder abuse.
- 18% fear retaliation or further abuse.
- 16% have no awareness of available resources.
- 60% older women lack awareness on redressal mechanisms available for abuse.
- 80% older women are not aware of government welfare schemes
- 16% are aware of the Maintenance & Welfare of Parents & Senior Citizens Act.
- 71% older women are not in a position to make decisions for
- · themselves.
- 65% older women reported not having health insurance.
- 69% older women in India don't own any assets (such as vehicle, immovable / immovable property).
- 51% of the older women have reported being 'never' employed.
- 74% are not working.
- 32% older women want work till as long as possible.
- Nearly 70% of the older women have reported a lack of adequate and accessible employment opportunities.
- 53% of the older women do not feel financially secure. Of the 47% who do feel secure, 80% are dependent on their children
- for finances.
- 73% older women do not have any savings.
- 67% older women are in caregiving roles.
- 43% elderly women worry about getting physically hurt. 76% say its due to 'fear of falling' and 46% stating due to weak eyesight.
- 60% older women have never used digital devices.

Top 3 Suggestions to Prevent or Reduce occurrence of Elder Abuse

- Raising awareness on elder abuse through education campaigns (59%).
- Strengthening laws and penalties for elder abuse (51%).
- Providing training to caregivers to recognize and address elder abuse (43%).

BIHAR

Mother Nature's Elder Custodian



79-year-old **Nirod Baran Adak** from Saluka village in West Bengal has created an ecological revolution that is transforming the land and lives around him. A member of the Baba 'Burohari Elder-Self-Help-Group' a part of the Maa Dakshineswari Village Level Federation, under project 'Saksham', he is an active participant in our livelihood programme enabling him to live a financially stable and independent life as a farmer.

But life wasn't always so for Nirod, the turning point came four years ago, when he participated in a HelpAge India training programme on organic farming in Supaul, Bihar, where he learnt how to make organic waste decompose, liquid manure, fertilisers, etc. He soon began preparing his own organic manure and pesticides, and used them on his patch of agricultural land and began to see much better results in his yields. His profit margins increased considerably with the money he was saving, by not

buying chemical fertilisers and pesticides. With a desire to help others, Nirod began training other farmers in his village helping them make a profit, as well as, improving the health of their lands. Seeing the remarkable results, neighbouring villages soon began seeking his expertise. He has now trained over 50 Elder-Self-Help-Groups!

A tireless ecological warrior, Nirod Baran is truly Mother Nature's custodian. When the world is grappling with the climate crisis, this motivational elder is helping plant a better future for us all!
