Towards Inclusive Ageing:

Uniting Generations, Strengthening Preparedness

Message from The Chairperson



India's population is ageing at a pace that would have seemed improbable only a generation ago. Today, over 12% of Indians are above the age of 60 - a number expected to rise to nearly one in five by 2050. This demographic shift carries implications far beyond statistics. It raises vital questions about identity, family structures, social support systems and more importantly raises the question: How prepared are we to meet the challenges of an ageing population?

A recent study done by HelpAge India titled, '**Ageing in India: Exploring Preparedness & Response to Care Challenges**' highlights the growing urgency for improved age preparedness, particularly among those outside the purview of most government welfare schemes, who have limited savings for later life. The current ecosystem remains challenged to address their needs across care, health, social, financial and digital inclusion. Therefore, it is imperative to develop focused programmes and services that address the diverse needs of older persons, particularly for those who are most vulnerable.

With increasing longevity and a rapidly growing elderly population, segments such as the 80+, older women and those living alone, face greater risks and require dedicated support mechanisms. Government initiatives like the National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly (NPHCE) and the recent inclusion of those 70 plus under the *Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana* (PM-JAY) are welcome developments. The latter, by extending health insurance coverage of up to Rs.5 lakh per family annually - thus ensuring better access to hospital care and financial protection for the elderly - marks important progress in healthcare. Despite these advances, the establishment of a comprehensive Long-Term Care (LTC) framework remains a pressing need, an urgent priority.

HelpAge has continued strengthening its elder care interventions — from setting up Elder Help Desks across states, to expanding its Mobile Healthcare Network, now also augmented through telehealth services that bring quality healthcare and support, virtually, at the doorsteps of disadvantaged elderly, even in the remotest of regions.

In addition, to ensure independence and mobility, our field teams are delivering much needed geriatric care assistance and assistive devices to elders in need. There is also the important aspect of mental well-being of elders, and HI has been focusing on this by building the capacity of community health workers, caregivers and senior citizens' association members, to detect and respond to early signs of mental health issues amongst the elderly. Meanwhile, the organization's livelihood programme continues to enhance social and financial security amongst elders, empowering them to live with dignity as active, contributing members of society.



Message from The CEO



This was a year shaped by listening, learning and leaning closer to the lives we touch - one that reminded us that every act of care begins with connection. As we work across communities and systems, our efforts continue to be guided by a single vision: to create a society where every senior citizen lives with dignity, purpose and belonging. In every programme, partnership and forum, our focus has remained on strengthening the fabric of inclusion and nurturing understanding between generations.

At the heart of our efforts is a commitment to remain present where elders need us most. Whether in dense urban neighbourhoods or remote rural settings, our teams work steadily to address neglect, isolation and vulnerability. Mobile healthcare, vision care, assistive devices and telehealth support are some of the key pathways that allow elders to remain independent, engaged and visible within their families and communities.

A large share of our work is with rural elders, whose lives are increasingly shaped by shrinking livelihoods, limited access to healthcare and weakening social networks. Through Elder Self-Help Groups (E-SHGs), we continue to witness how collective action can restore confidence and agency. These community-led platforms - driven largely by older women - strengthen savings, livelihoods and social bonds, reinforcing the idea that elders are not on the margins of development, but central to it.

Alongside community-based care, we continue to strengthen pathways to support and inclusion through public systems. Through our role in operating the Government of India's national helpline, Elderline - 14567, in select states, we help ensure that elders facing distress, neglect or loneliness are heard and supported with empathy and urgency. Our community mental health initiative, 'Project Saarthak', focuses on equipping caregivers and frontline workers to recognise distress early and respond with sensitivity.

We are also expanding spaces that encourage participation, learning and well-being through our Active Ageing Centres. These centres reflect the growing recognition that longevity must be accompanied by opportunity - to stay engaged, to learn, to connect and to live with purpose.

Evidence continues to guide our advocacy. Insights from our national study, 'Ageing in India: Exploring Preparedness & Response to Care Challenges', highlighted critical gaps in long-term care and mental well-being. We carried these learnings into policy dialogues and global platforms, advocating for age-friendly systems rooted in community realities and inclusive of older voices.

Public engagement and awareness remain important enablers of this work. Our campaigns during the year - #GenerationsTogether and #HaveYouEverAsked? - were designed to spark reflection and dialogue and to remind us that listening to elders is foundational to building an inclusive society. As Ms. Sharmila Tagore, our Honorary Brand Ambassador, aptly observed, *"When generations come together, possibilities multiply."*

None of this would be possible without the enduring support of those who stand with us. I remain deeply grateful to our individual donors, philanthropists, impact investors, CSR partners and public institutions, who share our commitment to ensuring that ageing is met with care, respect and inclusion.

As we look ahead, let us continue to nurture a society bound by connection and compassion - one where each generation strengthens the other and where growing older is accompanied not by exclusion, but by dignity and shared purpose.

Strengthening Elder Services, Care & Empowerment Models



Enabling Responsive Assistance for Elders



In a significant step towards improving services for senior citizens, HelpAge India added Elder Help Desks in SNM Hospital in Leh (Ladakh), National Centre for Ageing in Chennai (Tamil Nadu), Government Institute of Medical Sciences in Greater Noida (Uttar Pradesh) and the Indian Institute of Advanced Medical Sciences in Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh). Managed by HelpAge India in collaboration with the hospitals, these Help Desks aim to provide dedicated support to elderly patients - from wheelchair assistance, OPD card registrations, to doctor appointment bookings, prescription explanations, and guidance to the hospital's pharmacy where the medicines are available for elders at a discounted rate. The team also helps with scheduling follow-up appointments, accompanying elders to get diagnostic tests, and helps link them to relevant government schemes.

Advancing Community-Based Mental Health Support for the Elderly



HelpAge India supported the Social Welfare Department of Uttar Pradesh in organising a government-led capacity-building workshop on community-based mental health support for senior care home managers and caregivers in Lucknow. The workshop brought together 158 participants from 48 districts, representing Department-run senior care homes across the state. Mr. Krishna Prasad, Deputy Director, Social Welfare Department, and Ms. Anamika Singh, District Social Welfare Officer, were the driving force behind organising the workshop, while HelpAge India provided implementation support.

The event focused on enhancing the quality of mental health care for senior citizens through expert-led sessions and interactive discussions on diagnostic and caregiving challenges, as well as, innovative care solutions with technical support from the Department of Geriatrics Mental Health, KGMU, Lucknow.

Facilitating Government-Led Regional Support for Quality Ageing Services



Under the aegis of the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE), HelpAge India is implementing Regional Resource and Training Centres (RRTCs) in Tamil Nadu and Himachal Pradesh with strategic guidance from the National Institute of Social Defence (NISD).

These Centres serve as regional hubs to strengthen the delivery of senior care programmes, supporting state governments and stakeholders through specialised training on geriatric care and inter-generational engagement, awareness-building on key ageing issues and research to inform policy and practice in the field of agecare.

Contributing to National Discourse on Geriatric Mental Health



HelpAge India participated in the National Annual Conference of the Indian Association for Geriatric Mental Health, GERON 2024, at NIMHANS, Bengaluru. The theme of the Conference was 'Geriatric Mental Health in India – Past, Present & Future', bringing together experts, practitioners, and researchers from across the country.

Dr. Ritu Rana, Mission Head – Healthcare, HelpAge India, co-chaired the symposium on 'Service Models for Geriatric Mental Health'. Additionally, NIMHANS formally recognised HelpAge India's work in the sphere of mental well-being of elders, through its community-based initiative Project 'Saarthak'.

Participation in Multi-Stakeholder Dialogue on Elder Care

HelpAge India participated in a Two-Day State Level Conference on 'Tackling Issues among Elderly', organised by Madras Christian College, Chennai, Tamil Nadu, in collaboration with the National Institute of Social Defence (NISD). At the conference, Mr. Edwin Babu, Acting State Head - Tamil Nadu, delivered a session on 'Navigating Care and Support for the Elderly', addressing key challenges faced by older persons and the need for a robust support system.

He highlighted the importance of accessible healthcare, financial security and community-driven care solutions, through multi-stakeholder partnerships, to ensure dignity and well-being in later years.

Engaging in such dialogues and fostering partnerships with academia, government, and civil society is crucial in driving meaningful change for elder welfare. Collective efforts and shared knowledge pave the way for stronger policies and inclusive support systems, ensuring a better future for our senior citizens.





Songs of Freedom and Belonging



At 64, **Tsewang Namgyal** from Leh–Ladakh carries with him a lifetime of toil and hardship. Years of living alone had left him vulnerable, anxious, and in urgent need of care and companionship.

When our team was alerted to his situation, they stepped in swiftly, relocating him to the HelpAge Senior Care Home in Leh. There, with access to regular healthcare, nourishing meals, and the comfort of a caring community, Tsewang's life began to transform. The elder who once felt weighed down by loneliness now radiates health, happiness & hope.

Despite his hearing impairment, Tsewang is never left behind.

Our caregivers and support staff ensure he feels included and heard, making sure his world is full of warmth and connection.

What brings him the most joy is singing. He often breaks into song, his voice carrying not just melody, but the story of a man who has found freedom from hardship and the delight of belonging. His songs are a testament to resilience, renewal, and the beauty of ageing with dignity.

'Elderpreneurs' Serving Strength



Meeet 68-year-old **Mutthulaxmi**, fondly known as 'Idli Amma' of Villupuram, Tamil Nadu. Along with her husband, Natrajan, she is proving that age is no barrier to fulfilling one's dreams — or serving delicious *idlis*.

Just a few years ago, the couple struggled to survive, working as daily-wage earners rolling papers for firecrackers. With little support from their grown children, life seemed uncertain and insecure.

That's when HelpAge India's Project Astitva (Identity) stepped in. Through Elder-Self-Help-Groups, the project empowers seniors to take charge of their livelihoods. Inspired, Mutthulaxmi dreamt of starting an *idli* batter-making unit. With a small loan, she purchased a grinder and set up shop in her modest one-room home. Natrajan took charge of deliveries,

pedalling through their neighbourhood with fresh batter for families and local shops.

Today, the couple no longer worries about their next meal or their future. Their journey shows the power of supporting elder entrepreneurs — with the right tools, they can create security, dignity, and joy for themselves.



A Centenarian's Strength Met with Care



Can you imagine yourself as a 101-year-old visiting a hospital on your own? Our Elders Help Desk team had the fortune of serving such an inspiring centenarian. **Mr. R.S. Mishra** from Pratapgarh, Uttar Pradesh, lives with and looks after his wife, who is suffering from mental health issues.

Their only son is an army officer, whose duty requires him to be away from home for several months in a year. Despite wanting to be able to be there for his ageing parents, he is bound by his duty to a larger family - the nation.

True to the spirit of an Armed Forces family, Mr. Mishra is still completely self-reliant and independent. However, multiple health struggles such as a tumour surgery, knee problems and hearing loss, have impacted his mobility and strength.

So, when our team saw him walk unsteadily into the Sanjay Gandhi Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences (SGPGI) Hospital in Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh) on his own, they immediately went up to him to offer support. Navigating large hospitals can be sometimes difficult, especially if one's mobility is challenged. From providing him with wheelchair assistance, to helping him with the registration process, OPD consultation and check-up, the team helped him every step of the way.

Handled with patience, gentleness & compassion, the Help Desk team guided and assisted him throughout the process, leaving him feeling valued and respected.



The Criticality of Continuous Care



In the quiet village of Bagoli, Uttarakhand, 71-year-old **Chunni Devi** is a familiar face at HelpAge's Mobile Healthcare Unit site. Living with hypertension, she relies on the MHU for regular check-ups and medication. So, when she suddenly missed a visit, the team grew concerned and decided to check in on her at home.

There, they learned that just days earlier she had suffered a severe headache, followed by numbness on one side of her body. Alarmed, her family had rushed her to the nearest hospital, where doctors advised them to take her to AIIMS for further treatment. But with limited resources, they brought her back home instead, worried yet helpless.

When our team spoke to the family, they revealed that Chunni Devi had not taken her blood pressure medication for over a week. The risk this posed was clear. Without delay, the MHU team provided the prescribed medicines, and gradually her condition began to stabilise.

Her story is a powerful reminder of how fragile elder health can be, and how critical continuity of care and vigilance are in managing chronic conditions. With timely intervention and consistent support, recovery becomes possible — and lives can be safeguarded.



Defying Age and Social Barriers



6 9-year-old **Arati Devi** from Kolaghat, West Bengal, has defied every possible ageing stereotype and social barrier. As a widow, living with her son and daughter-in-law, under a traditional set-up she would have been largely dependent on her family and have little say in family matters, but as a member of the HelpAge initiated 'Gourniti Elder-Self-Help-Group' (ESHG), Arati Devi has taken the reins of her life into her own hands and has also become the captain of her family's ship.

With the help of a seed fund provided by the ESHG, she set up a vegetable shop, through which she is able to not only sustain herself but also contribute to the family's needs.

She wakes up at 4 am every morning and sets up her shop in the main market, where she is loved by one and all. Her sincerity, hard work and dedication is admired by her fellow shopkeepers as well as her loyal customers.

Hers is a tale of dignity, empowerment and the transformative power of self-belief.

Healing Pain and Hopelessness

In the remote village of Hakimpur in Bihar, lives 73-year-old **Baban Singh**. A widower, Baban resides with his youngest son and daughter-in-law, supporting a family of five. As his son is working in another State, the responsibility of the household has fallen squarely on his ageing shoulders. Despite his frail health, Baban works tirelessly as a daily wage labourer.

For years, Baban silently endured chronic joint pain and worsening asthma. The nearest healthcare facility is several kilometres away - an insurmountable distance for an elderly man without transportation. His condition deteriorated, leaving him in constant pain and without hope.



One day, Baban Singh heard that a van had arrived in a nearby village, offering medical services with a qualified doctor on-board. He decided to pay it a visit. For the first time, he received quality medical care that was accessible, free and most importantly, trustworthy.

Since receiving treatment from HelpAge's Mobile Healthcare Unit (MHU), Baban's health has significantly improved. His joint pain is manageable, his breathing is better, and his confidence has returned. No longer burdened by medical expenses, he has been able to save a little for his grandson's education, a dream that once seemed impossible.



Digital Bridges of Inclusion



In a world increasingly shaped by technology, staying connected has become essential to inclusion and independence. For many older persons, however, navigating the digital landscape can be daunting - a gap HelpAge India's Digital Literacy programme seeks to bridge.

At 73, **Mr. Asit Chowdhury**, a retired businessman from Kolkata, joined one of our workshops with some prior experience of using his smartphone for WhatsApp, Facebook, and online searches. Yet, he often found himself dependent on others for basic functions and unaware of key safety practices that protect against online risks.

Through the digital literacy session, he discovered practical ways to use his phone more effectively - from navigating with Google Maps to managing storage and saving contacts independently. Learning to share his live location on WhatsApp not only enhanced his sense of safety while travelling but also reassured his family. With new knowledge of digital hygiene, he gained the confidence to manage his device, block unwanted callers, and prevent automatic downloads, improving both his privacy and his peace of mind.

The impact was immediate and tangible. Everyday challenges that once caused frustration were replaced by confidence and self-reliance. He now engages with technology as a tool for empowerment, communication, and independence — a powerful shift for someone who once felt left behind by the digital world.

His journey reflects the broader goal of HelpAge India's digital empowerment initiative: to ensure that older persons are not excluded from the digital age, but equipped to embrace it safely, confidently and with dignity.



A Long Awaited Homecoming



If you ever doubt that every small act of individual and community support has the power to transform someone's life, this story will serve as a powerful reminder. A young university student had been noticing an elderly man in a frail condition lying on the streets of Mussoorie (Uttarakhand) for some days. Seeing his condition deteriorate, the student promptly contacted HelpAge India's Uttarakhand office seeking immediate assistance.

Our team quickly mobilized to the location. Their immediate priority was to provide first-line relief - offering food, water, and ensuring the elder was as comfortable as possible.

As the team engaged with the elder, they discovered that he was originally from Bihar. They then promptly reported the case to the local police station to ensure official documentation and further assistance. Simultaneously, with the support of the HelpAge Bihar team, they traced the elder's *tehsil* and address in Bihar, from where he originally belonged. The teams worked tirelessly to ensure the man's safe return.

After days of co-ordination, their efforts paid off. The elderly man's family was located, and his brother was contacted. Without delay, his brother travelled to Uttarakhand to take him back home. The reunion was emotional, leaving everyone teary-eyed and grateful.

This case is a demonstration of the power of compassion and collaborative effort. From a concerned student's initiative to the co-ordinated action taken by HelpAge teams in Uttarakhand and Bihar, this intervention highlights the importance of community-driven support for the elderly. Together, through persistence and passion of the team, an elderly man was not only saved but also reunited with his family with dignity, back to his home & hearth.

Policy Advocacy & Thought Leadership



Shaping Inclusive State Policy for Older Persons in Ladakh



HelpAge India was honoured to be a part the 'Consultative Discussion on State Policy on Older Persons of Ladakh' with the theme 'Working Towards an Age Friendly Ladakh' presided over by Chief Guest, Adv. Tashi Gyalson Chairman/CEC, Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC), Leh. It was an honour to host the proceedings at our Senior Care Home in Shey, Ladakh.

The formation of a State Policy is critical to address the varied needs of the elderly of Ladakh and forms a large part of the work HelpAge has been doing in Leh-Ladakh for the past 14 years, in areas of healthcare & agecare for the elderly.

The panel discussion was enriched by inputs from concerned stakeholders, experts and community representatives. These included Director, Social and Tribal Welfare, UT Ladakh, Mr. Tashi Dolma; Councillor, Thiksey, Mr. Stanzin Chosfai and Former Chief Secretary, J&K, Mr. Chewang Phuntsog (IAS). The panel highlighted the need for a state policy for the older persons of Ladakh and included discussion points like reimagining eldercare, working towards an age-friendly Ladakh and what kind of facilities elderly in Ladakh need.

Contributing to National Policy Deliberations on Ageing



HelpAge India participated in the seminar 'Ageing in India: Actionable Solutions', jointly organised by the National Human Rights Commission, NITI Aayog, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment (MoSJE), Govt. of India, and Sankala Foundation. The seminar brought together key experts and policymakers, including Mr. Bharat Lal, Secretary General, NHRC, Dr. V.K. Paul, Member (Health), NITI Aayog, Mr. C.K. Mishra, Former

Secretary, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Dr. K. Madan Gopal, Advisor, NHSRC and Mr. Amir Yadav, Secretary, MoSJE, among others.

Representing HelpAge India, Ms. Anupama Datta, Head – Policy Research & Advocacy, HelpAge India, who advocated for collaborative efforts to support India's ageing population to address the health and nutritional needs of disadvantaged elders, as well as, to ensure their economic security, social inclusion and improved quality of life.

Sharing Practice & Perspectives at the Asia-Pacific Regional Dialogue on Ageing

HelpAge India participated in the 2024 Asia-Pacific Regional Conference on Ageing in Bali co-hosted by HelpAge International, in partnership with the Ministry of National Development Planning of Indonesia and UNFPA.

We participated in three key sessions on:

- i) Harnessing Technology for Enhanced Quality of Life – moderated by Mr. Prateep Chakraborty, Chief Operating Officer.
- ii) Scaling up Community-Based Organisations in Ageing Societies – with a presentation by Dr. Imtiaz Ahmed, Mission Head – Agecare.
- iii) Bridging the Digital Divide & Strengthening Inter-generational Relations – led by Mr. Rohit Prasad, Chief Executive Officer, who was also the commentator during the closing session, 'Reframing Ageing: Reflections on the Conference'.



Shaping Discourse on Elder Well-Being in Odisha



HelpAge India participated in the Odisha Vikas Conclave and discussed aspects of health, nutrition and ageing, and also engaged with academicians from local universities. A chapter in the 'Odisha Demographic Report 2024' published by Centre for Youth and Social Development on 'Demographic Transition: The Ageing Factor' was contributed by Ms. Bharati Chakra, State Head – Odisha and Ms. Anupama Datta, Head - Policy Research &

Advocacy, from HelpAge India. Current policies & programmes were reviewed, bringing out gaps with reference to the challenges and opportunities brought on by demographic transition.

Representation at the UN ESCAP Committee on Social Development



HelpAge India was honoured to be a part of the 8th session of the UN ESCAP Committee on Social Development. Mr. Rohit Prasad, CEO, was a panellist for the discussion on 'Assessing Demographic Trends and Inter-generational Relations in Asia and the Pacific'. Representing the extensive work of HelpAge India directly with communities on the ground and in shaping systems and policies, Mr. Prasad spoke on inter-generational approaches in health (keeping a life course approach and particularly in supporting mental health & well-being), lifelong learning (critical for the goal of active & productive ageing), and bridging technology or 'digital divide' (by all stakeholders – government, private and social sector – for rapidly enabling digital literacy & safety and improving the adoption rate amongst seniors).

Participation in State Policy Dialogue on Ageing in Madhya Pradesh



HelpAge India was honoured to participate in a pivotal policy dialogue titled 'Redefining the Golden Years: A Modern Approach to Ageing in Madhya Pradesh', organised by the Madhya Pradesh Rajya NITI Aayog and the Planning, Economics & Statistics Department, Government of Madhya Pradesh, in Bhopal. The event explored innovative strategies to address the evolving needs of India's ageing population. Mr. Prateep Chakraborty, Chief Operating Officer, HelpAge India, delivered the keynote address, highlighting a national perspective on elderly care and the need for tailored models to tackle urban and rural challenges. Ms. Sanskriti Khare, State Head - Madhya Pradesh, HelpAge India, shared details about successful community-based care models for seniors and grassroots initiatives transforming elderly lives in the region.

Marking 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day'



Launch of Research Report

HelpAge India, marked the UN-designated 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day' (June 15) with the release of its nationwide report, 'Ageing in India: Exploring Preparedness & Response to Care Challenges'.

The nationwide study assessed the care needs of older persons, covering aspects like healthcare access, social care, elder abuse, financial capacity, and digital technology access. The study involved a cross-sectional survey across ten states and twenty cities, including both Tier I and Tier II cities, ensuring a representative sample of more than 5000 elderly individuals and 1300 caregivers.

The study was designed keeping in mind future trends like urbanization, self-reliance, primacy of market and tech solutions to social and economic challenges. The report focuses on existing care and support systems for elderly and accessibility.



Creating an Inclusive Eldercare Ecosystem: Catalysing Partnerships

The theme for marking 'World Elder Abuse Awareness Day' was 'Creating an Inclusive Eldercare Ecosystem: Catalysing Partnerships', which focussed on the inclusion of older persons across all spheres. Through cross-sectoral panel discussions we explored the roles various stakeholders play in ensuring elders live an empowered & dignified life, whether it be the private sector, government, community, institutions or family.

A thought-provoking campaign was launched titled '#PoochhaHainKabhi? /#HaveYouEverAsked?' a question, we hoped to raise amongst all stakeholders.

The focus was on what 'elders want' and 'what they need'. When was the last time they were asked what they need, to lead a healthy, happy & dignified life? What are their voices and choices? While the campaign raised the question to all stakeholders, there was special focus on 'the family unit' - the primary carers of our elderly - with the aim of raising sensitivity and awareness across households.



Marking 'International Day of Older Persons'

PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

Our programmes & services continue to transform elder lives, empowering disadvantaged elders and their communities to live with dignity, good health and active engagement. Here is an overview of our work on-ground.



Supported more than **2 million elders** across the country through its programmes and initiatives.



Through our role in operating the Government of India's national helpline, **Elderline - 14567**, in select states, we provided information, guidance, emotional care, legal aid, rescue support and elder abuse redressal to **35,031 elders**.



Senior care homes across the country offered barrier-free, **dignified living spaces** that promote quality care, **independence** and **active ageing** for older persons.



Multi-Activity Day Care Centres served as vibrant community hubs in Himachal Pradesh and Kerala, welcoming **72,003 elder participants** through the year.



Through the Support-A-Gran Programme (SAGP), **1051 elders** received sustenance and care across **8 states**.



Geriatric Care Assistance reached **1,28,370 elders** through HelpAge Elder Help Desks at leading hospitals such as AIIMS (Delhi, Rishikesh, Raipur), Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital (Chennai), SGPGIMS (Lucknow), Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (Hyderabad), JIPMER (Puducherry) and Sonam Nurboo Memorial Hospital (Leh).



Project 'Sugamya' provided assistive devices to **16,693 elders**, enhancing their independence and mobility.



Through Senior Citizens Associations and elder groups, we engaged **92,602 elders** via workshops and events, reaching nearly **77,300 elders** with training and awareness on digital literacy, legal and financial rights, health, and the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act.



Our Mobile Healthcare Network, operated 161 units across **2,845 villages** in **23 states and Union Territories**, delivering primary healthcare and health awareness to over **13 lakh elders**, with more than **28 lakh treatments** provided.



Through Telehealth, an additional **48,133 elders** received primary healthcare, with **61,680 treatments** delivered to remote and disadvantaged communities.



Vision care initiatives included **37,657 cataract surgeries** and **13,000** spectacles distributed to elders with refractive errors.



'Saarthak', our community-based mental well-being initiative, conducted **200 workshops** across **18 states**, building the capacity & awareness of community health workers, caregivers & senior citizens association members to detect and address early signs of mental health issues among elders.



Our disaster response efforts provided immediate relief to **1,741 flood-affected people** in Bihar, Kerala, and Tamil Nadu, while winter relief in Uttarakhand protected vulnerable elders from extreme cold.



Over **91,415 physiotherapy treatments** were delivered, helping elders manage back pain, arthritis, and other age-related mobility challenges.



Our livelihood & resilience programme continued to thrive, with **3,412 Elder-Self-Help-Groups (ESHGs)** across **10 states, 16 project locations**, and **446 villages**, benefiting **42,649 elders** (63% women) with social and financial security. 70% of these groups now operate independently.



HelpAge India's 'Community Digital Volunteers' enabled over **10,000 elders** in accessing Government schemes and services through the Government of India's Common Services Centres (CSCs) under the **Digital India initiative**.

Each number represents more than statistics — it reflects lives touched, independence restored, and dignity preserved for elders.






